Alex is the author of The Time Rider series of books and he agreed to come and talk about his books to all in Years 9 + 10.

Colin came in to talk about his book *Running With The Reservoir Pups*, which has been recently re-published.



Before the day, during library periods, Year 8 had been learning about Colin and his work, so it was with much anticipation that he was welcomed to the Drama Theatre.

Colin's book *Running With The Reservoir Pups* is an adventure story set locally and is a real page turner involving kidnapping, with a main character called Eddie Malone and a Belfast gang called *The Reservoir Pups*.

After talking about his career as an author, Colin read a passage from his book and finished off with a question and answer session from the Year 8 students.

Students then had the opportunity to buy copies of the book, signed personally by Colin.

Why not check out Colin's other books, a selection of which are stocked in the library?





WORLD BOOK DAY BOOK SWAP


All worked very diligently as the prize was a £25 Tesco voucher.

WITH THE RING OF EARTH




The 2011 Northern Ireland Book Award has been won by Chris Bradford's *The Ring of Earth*. The winner was announced at the grand finale on 6th April.


Also at the event, the author Liz Pichon (pictured below) gave an interesting illustrated talk about her book and career as both an author and illustrator.
